Did you know?

- female sturgeon spawn every 2-10 years
- a full-sized female can release up to 1,000,000 eggs!
- sturgeon eggs are sticky
- sturgeon have no bones only cartilage
- sturgeon lived during the time of dinosaurs!

Researchers work year-round to learn more about White Sturgeon in the Fraser and Nechako rivers.
